Dear Congresswoman Torres,

Because you represent Ontario, Chino, Montclair, Pomona, have visited our plant and met with us personally in Washington D.C., we thought you would be interested in the good things happening in your district during this challenging COVID-19 time.

On March 22, Jennifer Paige of RSM, a widowed single mother to two teenage boys, one of whom has special needs, recognized and responded to the sudden and urgent need for masks for healthcare workers and first responders.

Two days later Kathy Marvin heard of the project and the need for the ability to cut mask material at a higher rate. She mentioned it to her husband Michael and he immediately said he thought PRC had a potential solution to the production problem. Michael brought the challenge to the other executive managers and a plan was immediately hatched to repurpose the computerized cutting machine at PRC and also to fund the procurement of the materials needed for the masks. Because of this new partnership, Jenn's mobilization effort to equip our healthcare workers with masks was suddenly able to donate 500 masks per day!

The demand for masks has only increased each day since March 22. Partnering together, PRC and RSM Face Mask Volunteers have donated more than 7,000 masks made by more than 60 volunteer sewers, to frontline workers all over the United States, including hospitals, oncology centers, doctor's offices, assisted living centers, nursing homes, the United States Army, the United States Marine Corp, the USS Theodore Roosevelt, Camp Pendleton, police, firefighters, midwives, and more.

Since this is happening right in your own district, we thought you would be interested and hopefully motivated to come and visit us or point some media attention our way. Regardless, we will continue to make, donate and distribute face masks until there is no longer a need. As we've all said, it sure feels good to be doing something so needed and positive during this COVID crisis when many are feeling helpless and sad.
